Facts about Chocolates

Chocolate was first invented in 1847 by Joseph Fry. He discovered that chocolate could be made into a solid form by adding cocoa butter to the chocolate liquor.

Switzerland had the highest chocolate consumption per capita in 2017, with an average of 8.8 kg per person. This is higher than any other country in the world.

The average chocolate bar contains insect fragments. The U.S Food and Drug Administration has set a standard that anything more than 60 insect pieces per 100 grams of chocolate is rejected.
